


TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. Any Native, enfranchised or otherwise, shall be eligible to play.
- 2. Any player, coach or manager found under the influence of alcohol during the Tournament shall be automatically suspended. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 3. Senior games will be two 20-minute halves. Intermediate games will be four 8-minute quarters.
- 4. Seniors will play 5 minute overtime periods for tie games. Intermediates will play 3 minute overtime periods. Any further overtime will be sudden death.
- 5. Line-ups must be in the hands of the scorekeepers 20 minutes before game time.
- 6. All teams must be ready to go on the floor immediately after the previous game.
- 7. Players passes will be issued for entry to all games. These passes will not be valid for games on Saturday, Mar. 4, unless playing.
- 8. Awards will be presented immediately following the final game.

 A committee has been formed to pick the All Star Teams, Most
 Valuable players and Most Sportsmanlike team.
- 9. Any protests must be in the hands of Chief Referee Bill Morrison, in writing, no later than 30 minutes following the game.
- 10. The 1961 Canadian Amateur Basketball Association Rules will govern the Tournament.
- 11. In cases of uniforms clashing, a toss of a coin will decide the team that must change.


This year's tournament will be bigger and better than last year's. Tell all your friends about it.



Let's Have a Look at Last Year

Last year's attempt at reviving the Tournament proved most successful for both the Natives and the Basketball Association.

Held at the Civic Centre on March 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th, some 15 teams entered from neighbouring villages and various organizations.

The 10 Senior Clubs were Kitimaat, Rupert Thunderbirds, Greenville, Port Simpson YPEA, Port Simpson Athletic Club, Kitkatla KEC, Kitkatla Aces, Aiyansh, Miller Bay Vikings and Hartley Bay.

Due to a death in the village, Hartley Bay had to withdraw at the last moment. The High School Rainmakers filled in for Hartley Bay, whose games were defaulted to their opponents.

The Intermediate teams were Manson's Tom-Tom Five, Rupert Royals, Metlakatla, Port Simpson and Aiyansh.

Officiating at the opening ceremonies were Frank Calder, MLA, and Dr. R. G. Large, who represented the City of Prince Rupert.

Wink Willox, Educational Director for the B.C. Basketball Referee's Association, attended as a guest. Mr. Willox put on a display for the fans on various aspects of rule infractions. He also took the odd turn at refereeing.

Sharply at 9:00 a.m. on March 2nd, the first game of the 1960 series got underway as Miller Bay Vikings beat Port Simpson YPEA 76-53. The following game saw Aiyansh Comets edge Rupert Royals in a thriller. The final score was 37-36.

In other games that day, Kitimaat won out over Aiyansh Y's 72-64 in a game that was action packed throughout. Manson's Tom-Tom five took Metlakatla 38-30. Jackie White fired home 22 points to lead Port Simpson AC's to a resounding 63-29 win over Aiyansh

inating the Kitimaat squad 44-33 in the early rounds of the 1951 tournament.

Port Simpson, however, lost in the finals as a strong Kitkatla contingent snatched the championship in an exciting 46-41 victory to gain the new B.C. Packer Trophy; (Kitimaat retained the old trophy as they won the series three years in a row).

Wyler Innes of Kitkatla won the Most Valuable Player trophy and a gold medal. Silver Medals were presented annually to members of winning teams each year after 1950.

The smallest crowd in the history of the tourney was on hand to see the thrilling 1951 games. Cold weather and high winds prevented the outlying coastal villages from making the trek. Another factor preventing greater attendance at the games was poor accommodations for both teams and spectators.

Interest in the tourneys slowly began to wane as in 1952, the tournament, to be held in Port Simpson, was called off when entries were so few in number it didn't constitute enough teams to make the effort worthwhile.

A final attempt to hold the tournament was made in April of 1953. Only four teams attended. After many tries, Port Simpson finally gained the B.C. Packer Trophy with a 51-40 win over Kitkatla. Vernon Dudoward, who netted 32 points during the game, was Most Valuable Player.

No real effort to hold the contests was made until last year.



All Native Basketball

by Ken Specht

Even prior to 1947, basketball had long been a serious sporting endeavor among the coastal Indian villages, but no formal attempt had been made to decide the most formidable array of talent despite the fact that innumerable local jousts were held. In 1947, the Prince Rupert Basketball Association decided to hold the first Northern British Columbia Tournament.

On March 12, some 400 spectators and seven All Native teams trooped to the Roosevelt Gym and displayed such sportsmanship during the highly successful tourney that it was decided to hold the meetings annually.

The three day agenda that year saw Kincolith emerge from the Tournament after a decisive 55-40 victory over Aiyansh to win the B.C. Packer Trophy.

The Most Valuable Player award, presented by 99 Taxi, was given to David Doolan for his good sportsmanship and basketball ability.

The next three consecutive annual All-Native Basketball Tournaments, played at the Civic Centre, were dominated by a powerful Kitimaat village contingent who outplayed and outscored all opposition they met.

Perhaps one of the greatest stars to emerge from the three year Kitimaat domination was Chris Wilson of the victors who won the Bill Scuby Most Valuable Player Trophy three straight years.

Wilson, Kitimaat's lanky centre, always delighted the fans as he consistently garnered 20 or 30 points per game.

In 1950, the competitions were handled and organized by a Native Basketball Association committee.

During Kitimaat's reign, the smelter city village gained their last two titles by virtue of wins over Port Simpson by scores of 65-35 and 53-30.

The Port Simpson Athletic Club gained their revenge by elim-(Continued on Page 9)




